Reports Due Before the July 14, 2020, Primary Runoff Election

This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in the primary runoff election

July 6, 2020: Runoff Report must be received by July 6.

July 5, 2020 to July 13, 2020 at noon: Period for filing for Daily Pre-Election Reports.

July 6, 2020: Runoff Report. Candidates in the primary runoff election must file a runoff report due eight days before the election. This runoff report <u>must be received</u> by the Texas Ethics Commission (TEC) by July 6. All political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with the election are also required to file this runoff report. The first day covered by the report is February 23. The last day covered by the report is July 4.

NOTE: Candidates and Political Committees participating in this runoff election WILL NOT FILE THE JULY **2020 SEMIANNUAL** report because these pre-election reports cover the semiannual reporting period.

July 5 – July 13, 2020: Daily Pre-Election Reports(s) For Contributions. The period for filing a daily pre-election report begins on July 5 and ends at noon on July 13. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees: A candidate or specific-purpose committee that is involved in the primary runoff election and accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$1,790 during the reporting period must file the daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report <u>must be received</u> by the TEC by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$1,790.
- General-Purpose Committees: A general-purpose committee must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in the primary runoff election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$6,090 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$1,790 or a group of candidates that total more than \$26,780 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report <u>must be received</u> by the TEC by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the TEC are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline*.
