Reports Due Before the January 23, 2021, Special Election for House District 68

This notice only applies to candidates and committees that are involved in this special election

January 15, 2021: 8-day campaign finance report must be received by January 15.

January 14, 2021, to January 22, 2021, at noon: period for filing daily pre-election reports.

January 19, 2021: Personal Financial Statement (PFS) due by January 19.

January 15, 2021: The 8-day pre-election campaign finance report <u>must be received</u> by the Texas Ethics Commission by January 15, 2021. Candidates for the office must file *even if there was no activity* during the reporting period. Political committees that accept political contributions or make political expenditures and/or have other activity in connection with this election are also required to file this report. The first day covered by the report is January 1, 2021, or the date your campaign treasurer appointment was filed, or the day after the date the last report ended, as applicable. The last day covered by the report is January 13, 2021.

January 14, 2021 – January 22, 2021: The period for filing a daily pre-election report begins on January 14, 2021, and ends at noon on January 22, 2021. A filer may be required to file more than one daily pre-election report.

- Candidates and Specific-Purpose Committees: A candidate or specific-purpose committee that accepts political contributions from a single source that total more than \$1,860 during the reporting period must file a daily pre-election report. A daily pre-election report <u>must be received</u> by the Ethics Commission by the first business day after the date of the contribution that causes the total amount accepted from a contributor during the period to exceed \$1,860.
- **General-Purpose Committees:** A campaign treasurer of a GPAC or CEC must file a daily pre-election report if the committee is involved in this special election and if the committee accepts political contributions from a person that total more than \$6,370 during the reporting period, or makes direct campaign expenditures supporting or opposing either a single candidate that total more than \$1,860 or a group of candidates that total more than \$27,950 during the reporting period. A daily pre-election report **must be received** by the Ethics Commission by the first business day after the date the contribution is accepted or the expenditure is made that causes the total amount to exceed the applicable threshold.

January 19, 2021 (deadline extended due to holiday): The PFS must be filed no later than midnight Central Time Zone on January 19, 2021. This statement must cover financial activity for the calendar year ending December 31, 2020. It is required to be filed by all candidates on the special election ballot. The PFS must be filed electronically. An extension of this filing deadline is not available.

Further Information

Persons filing campaign finance reports with the Ethics Commission are required to file those reports electronically unless the person falls within the statutory exemption. *Electronic reports must be filed by midnight, Central Time Zone, on the night of the filing deadline.* Please refer to "Filing A Report" on our website for further information on electronic filing.
